township boards to keep a road maintenance log and the reports are to be turned into the Knox County Board on a quarterly basis; 2. Supr. Schlote had received a complaint on a Dowling Township road that needs to be graded and graveled. Discussion was held on the Dowling Township balance of County/Township Allocation funds, noting the road is neither a mail route or bus route, and gravel needed now and grading could be done later; 3. Long-time Road employee Larry Cross will be retiring June 1, 2017 so a memo will be sent to road employees to see if someone in-house would want to transfer into the Creighton shed; 4. Bridge meeting in Lincoln on May 4; 5. Engineering costs are up so that line item in the budget is over; 6. A notice had been placed in the papers stating that planting or fencing a road right-of-way is prohibited. A township board said that someone is planting in the right-of-way of a minimum maintenance road and this member questioned what the recourse is. The Board said that the township board should document the issue and try to handle the matter first and then come to the County Board if necessary; 7. At 10:34 a.m., Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the advertised public hearing for the reclassification from local roads to minimum maintenance on 3.25 miles in Herrick Township and Frankfort Township. Present were Herrick Township Board member Rick Stewart, Frankfort Township Board members Duane Guenther and Francis Steffen, and landowners Burl, Lois Ann and Dean Mormann. Herrick Township Board member Rick Stewart said that the request to reclassify a portion of roads was due to the fact that the number of these roads are already in minimum maintenance condition so to reduce costs and liability, the township boards want them properly labeled and signed as minimum maintenance. The Mormanns expressed concerns about one area of road that adjoins their pasture, they are not against the reclassification but would like the road to be fixed in the wet spots before reclassified to minimum maintenance, and they volunteered to use their equipment to help the township fix the road. Discussion was held on liability, adding sand to the gumbo areas, gating road and reclassification after the road is fixed.

WHEREAS, the Knox County Board of Supervisors had approved imposing an additional sales tax of one percent (1%) on March 30, 1989 for the County Visitors Promotion Fund and an additional sales tax of two percent (2%) on September 25, 2003 for the County Improvement Fund on the total consideration charged for occupancy of any space furnished by any hotel, lodging facility or campground in Knox County, Nebraska, and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given and a public hearing was held on May 11, 2017 as provided by law, to increase the additional sales tax by one percent (1%) to make a total of two percent (2%) to be paid to the Knox County Visitors Promotion Fund, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the additional sales tax imposed on the total consideration charged for occupancy of any space furnished by any hotel, lodging facility or campground in Knox County, Nebraska be increased to two percent (2%) that is to be paid to the Knox County Visitors Promotion Fund and that the additional sales tax for the Visitors Improvement Fund remain at two percent (2%), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total additional sales tax imposed on the total consideration charged for occupancy of any space furnished by any hotel, lodging facility or campground in Knox County, Nebraska will be four percent (4%).

Supt. Barta and the Board discussed purchasing reflective safety quilted jackets and stocking hats for County Road employees and other employees if needed. An NIRMA ASSIST Grant will be applied for that would reimburse the County for up to 75% of the costs; 3. Bridge crew update; 4. Bridge inspection update; 5. Fracture critical bridge inspection update; 6. Update on "Ray Stark" County/BIA bridge project. Engineering documents have been received and signatures are needed; 7. Present were Walnut Grove Township Board members Charles Cook and Kevin Cook, North Central Public Power District representative Brent Eggerling and Frank Sommer to discuss the vacation/abandonment. There have been several accidents in and near the gully and it would cost the Township a large sum of money to fix the gully. Also, the liability insurance paid by the Township Board is increasing due to the accidents. Discussion ensued on alternative routes for the fiber optic line to be placed. The Board left the public hearing open until Thursday, November 9, 2017 at 11:30 a.m. when discussion will resume on the vacation/abandonment of the portions of 873 RD and 514 Avenue in Walnut Grove Township.

At 11:00 a.m., Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the advertised hearing for reclassification of approximately 10 miles of roads in Walnut Grove Township from local maintenance to minimum maintenance. There is no opposition to six miles of roads however there are four miles adjoining Holt County that are in question. RESOLUTION #2017- 35 A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING SALARIES FOR THE ELECTED OFFICIALS OF KNOX COUNTY NEBRASKA

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 23-1114 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Nebraska, the Knox County Board of Supervisors are required to determine and set the salaries of the various elected officials of the County prior to January 15th of the year in which a General Election will be held for the respective offices,

WHEREAS, the Knox County Board of Supervisors, have met in order to establish the salaries for the elected officials of Knox County, Nebraska, for the term commencing January 2019, pursuant to Nebraska law. After conferring with county officials and citizens, and after reviewing the financial situation of county government, the Board finds it is necessary and proper to establish new salaries for the elected officials of Knox County, Nebraska.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of Supervisors of Knox County, Nebraska, that:

County Assessor. The annual salary for the office of County Assessor shall be established at \$60,709.72 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$62,227.47, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$63,783.16, and for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$65,377.74.

County Attorney. The annual salary for the office of County Attorney shall be established at \$60,709.72 for the

calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$62,227.47, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$63,783.16, and for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$65,377.74.

County Clerk. The annual salary for the office of County Clerk shall be established at \$60,709.72 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$62,227.47, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$63,783.16, and for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$65,377.74.

Clerk of District Court. The annual salary for the office of Clerk of District Court shall be established at \$60,709.72 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$62,227.47, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$63,783.16, and for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$65,377.74.

County Sheriff. The annual salary for the office of County Sheriff, including his or her services in managing the county jail, shall be established at \$69,109.72 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter a 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$70,837.46, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$72,608.40, for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$74,423.61. In the event the County enters into a contract with a city or village to provide contract law enforcement, the Sheriff will receive as additional salary \$500 per month for each contracted city or village during the period of any such contract.

County Surveyor. The annual salary for the office of County Surveyor shall be established at \$1000.00 for the calendar year 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022.

County Treasurer. The annual salary for the office of County Treasurer shall be established at \$60,709.72 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$62,227.47, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$63,783.16, and for the calendar year 2022 shall be \$65,377.74.

County Supervisor. The annual salary for the office of County Supervisor shall be established at 40% of the annual salary of the offices of County Assessor, County Attorney, County Clerk, County Clerk of District Court, County Sheriff and County Treasurer, that is, at \$24,283.89 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter a 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$24,890.99, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$25,513.27, and for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$26,151.11.

Chairman of the Board of County Supervisors. The annual salary for the Chairman of the Board of County Supervisors shall be \$25,602.35 for the calendar year 2019. For each year thereafter a 2.5% cost of living increase shall be added to the previous year's salary so the total amount for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$26,242.41, for the calendar year 2021 shall be \$26,898.47, and for the calendar year 2020 shall be \$27,570.93.

Deputies. The salaries of the Deputies of the County Assessor, the County Clerk, the County Clerk of the District Court and the County Treasurer shall be 75% of the respective elected officials.

Benefits. In addition to the above salary each Elected Official shall receive during his or her term of office a single health insurance coverage policy, a single dental/vision insurance coverage policy and a \$5,000 life insurance policy. Elected officials shall be enrolled in and shall receive the benefits of the County Employee's Retirement System, to participate in such programs on the effective date of such programs as approved by the County Board.

Cash in Lieu of Health Insurance. In addition to the above stated salary, a County Supervisor shall receive during his term of office at county expense an opt-out provision (aka "cash in lieu of" provisions) if a Supervisor opts out of the health and medical plan. This option will be available as permitted by Federal and State statutes and rules and regulations of agencies, including US Department of Treasury, US Internal Revenue Service, Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Pursuant to the "cash in lieu of" program, a Supervisor shall receive "cash in lieu" of health insurance.

County Assessor McManigal is researching the services of Joe Wilson with Tax Valuation, Inc. for commercial appraisal of elevators the larger commercial businesses (corrected 1-11-2018) in the County; 2. A pie chart was presented to the Board showing the comparison of taxes budgeted for 2017 compared to 2016. The chart shows that the total tax request for all entities was \$24,999,564.66 for 2017 which is \$725,832.06 more than 2016, and noting that the totals of each entity group increased except for the County which decreased.
