

PROCEEDINGS OF THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Center, Nebraska

April 16, 2025

9:30 a.m.

A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Wednesday, April 16, 2025 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Kevin G. Mlady District #2, David L. Pierce District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6 and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Sokol, Jr. presiding.

Supr. Mlady led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Crofton Journal newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

County Clerk Fischer read the April 3, 2025 meeting minutes. Chairman Sokol, Jr. approved the minutes of the April 3, 2025 meeting.

Correspondence reviewed was a copy of a letter from the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy regarding Mark Miller/Herzog Feedlot Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the public comment session at 9:45 a.m. Lee Greenwald with Baird Holm Law Firm gave public comments on tax matters regarding the North Fork Wind project.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Mlady that all claims except Claim #25040218, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote that Claim #25040218 payable to Elder Law Estate Planning in the amount of \$6,374.10 paid from the Inheritance Fund, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Abstain District #5. Motion carried.

Claims totaling \$337,039.43 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Pierce to place on file the Receipts Revenue List of March 31 – April 11, 2025. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to place on file the County Sheriff's Quarterly Report of Fees Collected between January 1 and March 31, 2025. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. closed the public comment session at 10:00 a.m.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess at 10:00 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:27 a.m.

County Attorney Knox Jensen met with the Board on the following: 1.) County Attorney Knox Jensen sent a letter to the Board for clarification as to her role and Deputy County Attorney John Thomas' role regarding advising Zoning Administrator Jelinek, the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors on wind and solar zoning regulations and any action relating to wind and solar in Knox County that may be taken by the Planning Commission or the Board. As Knox County is currently involved in litigation concerning zoning regulations on wind energy and represented by Special County Attorney David Begley, the Board said questions regarding wind and solar will be directed to Mr. Begley; 2.) Discussion ensued on reopening the west one-half mile portion of 893 RD (Platted Road #719) between Sections 2 and 11, T32N, R4W (Hill Township). That portion of road had been vacated/abandoned in 2012 and the title to that portion reverted to R & B Husker Valley, LLC as they owned the property adjacent on both the north and south sides of that portion of 893 RD (Platted Road #719). The Santee Sioux Nation wants that portion of the 893 RD reopened as it provides access to the Hobo Creek Cemetery as well as access to a parcel owned by the Santee Sioux Nation. Also, the Santee Sioux Nation said that the County vacated that portion of 893 RD without consulting with the Santee Sioux Nation, contrary to the County's promise in a Memo of Understanding dated January 1, 2006 between the Santee Sioux Nation, Knox County, and the Bureau of Indians Affairs. County Attorney Knox Jensen drafted an Agreement – Sale of Real Estate between R & B Husker Valley, LLC (seller) and the County of Knox (buyer) for the purchase of a 66-foot wide right of way located between the NW1/4 of Section 11 and the SW1/4 of Section 2, all in T32N, R4W being four acres more or less at a price of \$24,400. Discussed was fencing concerns, that the \$6,100 per acre would be paid with no fencing done by the County, the road ROW has been surveyed, Santee Sioux Nation would build and maintain the ROW according to County specifications, and to present the Agreement – Sale of Real Estate draft to R & B Husker Valley, LLC, and if negotiations fail then it would go to the condemnation process. Motion by Supr. Mlady, seconded by Supr. Schlote to approve the Agreement – Sale of Real Estate drafted by County Attorney Knox Jensen where the County of Knox (buyer) would pay \$24,400 to R & B Husker Valley, LLC for the purchase of a one-half mile portion of 893 RD (Platted Road #719) being a 66-foot wide right of way located between the NW1/4 of Section 11 and the SW1/4 of Section 2, all in T32N, R4W being four acres more or less, and such Agreement – Sale of Real Estate will be presented to R & B Husker Valley, LLC for consideration. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3.) Reviewed was a Notice that appointed counsel for an indigent defendant in a criminal case, other than the public defender, shall be compensated for all expenses which are reasonably and necessarily related to adequate legal representation in the amount of \$125 per hour which is an increase of \$50 per hour.

Librarians from Bloomfield, Creighton, Verdigre and Wausa met with the Board with annual reports of activities and what the County funds were used for at the six libraries in Knox County. The Board expressed their gratitude for the work

the librarians have done for their communities and Knox County. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Pierce to approve a cost-sharing distribution of \$5,000 to each of the six Knox County libraries with the funds to be paid from the Inheritance Fund. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Zoning Administrator Jelinek met with the Board on the following: 1.) Motion by Supr. Mlady, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to approve Administrative Plat Application #P2508 Scott Jordan on a 9.12-acre tract split in the W1/2NW1/4NW1/4 and the N1/2NW1/4SW1/4NW1/4 in Section 19, T32N, R2W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2.) Motion by Supr. Pierce, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to place on file the Planning Commission's Report to the Board of Supervisors on a recommendation to the Board to approve the Preliminary Plat of Heaven's Ridge Subdivision owned by Heaven's Ridge, LLC located in Section 13, T33N, R3W of the 6th P.M., Knox County, Nebraska with conditions including creation of a subdivision agreement. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 3.) Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the advertised public hearing at 11:00 a.m. on amendments to Section 4.07 Land Use Categories/Matrix for RAR (River Area Residential) of the Knox County Zoning Regulation, and the Change of Zoning, Planned Development, or Regulations Amendment Application #Z2501 submitted by Kirklyn D. Nielsen. Attorney Andrew Marshall representing Mr. Nielsen was present and gave testimony that the amendment would pertain to the Lazy River Acres area and the Santee area and that the current RAR allows only building a house but there is now more demand for camper pads and storage buildings. Kirklyn Nielsen wants to sell two 10-acre tracts in the Lazy River Acres area and changing the matrix would allow more options for the use of his tracts. Chairman Sokol, Jr. closed the public hearing at 11:10 a.m. There was no one present in opposition to the proposed amendments; 4.) Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Pierce to approve Change of Zoning, Planned Development, or Regulations Amendment Application #Z2501 submitted by Kirklyn D. Nielsen and to adopt **Resolution #2025 – 11** amending the current zoning regulation under Section 4.07 Land Use Categories/Matrix for RAR (River Area Residential). By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried;

RESOLUTION #2025 – 11

WHEREAS, the duly appointed Planning Commission of Knox County, Nebraska has prepared amendments to the Knox County Zoning Regulations for Knox County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has given public notice as required by the Nebraska State Statutes, of a hearing held on the 11th day of March 2025 at the Board of Supervisors' meeting room in the Knox County Courthouse on the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing has been held pursuant to said notice and all statements received at the hearing have been duly considered by the planning commission;

AND WHEREAS the Knox County Planning Commission has reviewed the amendments and make recommendation to the Knox County Board of Supervisors for approval;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, THAT THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED AND ADOPTED:

KNOX COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS

Section 4.07 Land Use Categories/Matrix

Amendments to the Land Use Categories/Matrix Section 4.07 for RAR (River Area Residential).

Use Category – Agricultural and Horticultural Uses – Use Type – Agriculture buildings general agricultural or storage uses – change from “Not permitted” to “Conditional Use Permit”

Use Category – Recreational Commercial – Use Type – Recreational vehicle (RV) Park- change from “Not permitted” to “Conditional use Permit”

Use Category – Auto Services/Commercial, not including Home Occupations – Use Type – Trailer, RV, & boat storage – change from “Not permitted” to “Conditional Use Permit”

Use Category – Warehousing and Storage – Use Type – Mini warehouse/self-storage – change from “Not permitted” to “Conditional Use Permit”

Borgmann to amend the current zoning regulation under Section 4.07 Land Use that "Trailer, RV, & Boat Storage" with the change from "Not permitted" to "Conditional Use Permit". By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 7.) Motion by Supr. Mlady, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to amend the current zoning regulation under Section 4.07 Warehousing and Storage – Use Type – Mini warehouse/self-storage with the change from "Not permitted" to to "Conditional Use Permit" under RAR. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 10.) Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Mlady to place on file the Planning Commission's March 11, 2025 meeting minutes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Weed Supt. Banks presented his Reports and Requirements for 2024 that included his office, inspection, and continuing education evaluations by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. Motion by Supr. Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Pierce to place on file the 2024 Department of Agriculture Reports and Requirements Score Card for Knox County Weed Supt. Banks. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Luke Bonkiewicz, Research Program Analyst with NACO, updated the Board on legislation, salary study, discussion on inheritance tax and possible revenue replacement, unfunded mandates, a "primer" for state senators, broadband, NACO West, new employee Lauren Franklin who will be the single point of contact, and encouragement for counties to join the National Association of County Officials.

Motion by Supr. Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve payment of an invoice from Sanne Repair, Tilden NE in the amount of \$6,275.00 from the LATCF Grant for installing equipment and wiring in the new Sheriff's Department Ford 150 4 x 4 pickup. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1.) Center West bridge project update; 2.) Bridge Crew update; 3.) Oil Crew update; 4.) Two pickups that had been designated as surplus property were sold at the Hartington Spring Consignment sale on April 14. The 2002 pickup sold for \$1,350 and the 2009 pickup sold for \$750; 5.) Two trailers have been filled with scrap iron and sold. The first trailer load of scrap iron weighed 14 tons and brought \$150 per ton; 6.) Supr. Mlady relayed to the Board that patrol operator Dustin Crosley said the road past Glad Tidings has an area where a culvert should be extended as water goes over the road in that area when it rains.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess for lunch at 11:59 a.m.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:55 p.m.

Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Mlady to go into closed session at 12:56 p.m. for Courthouse security issues. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried. Chairman Sokol, Jr. reiterated the closed session will be held on Courthouse security issues. The Board came out of closed session at 1:14 p.m.

Supr. Mackeprang left the meeting at 1:14 p.m.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote to go into closed session at 1:15 p.m. on pending litigation namely the North Fork Wind, LLC, etal v Knox County, etal lawsuit. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #5. Motion carried. Chairman Sokol, Jr. reiterated the closed session will be held on pending litigation namely the North Fork Wind, LLC, etal v Knox County, etal lawsuit. Zoning Administrator Jelinek was present during the closed session. The Board came out of closed session at 1:48 p.m.

Emergency Manager Taylor met with the Board on the following: 1.) Motion by Supr. Pierce, seconded by Supr. Mlady to approve the Joint Powers Agreement serving Yankton County, South Dakota and Cedar and Knox Counties in Nebraska. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6, and #7. Nays none. Absent District #5. Motion carried; 2.) Emergency Manager Taylor, Zoning Administrator Jelinek and County Clerk Fischer updated the Board on Hyper Reach, an emergency mass notification service. This service provides public safety, emergency communications and the power to create and send critical messages quickly and easily. Also, the service offers intuitive web and mobile interfaces, a full range of delivery methods, immediate feedback and reporting, multiple channels for notification for the public as to alerts, public and internal notifications, and other entities in the County can be added to the service. There are no limits to the number of users of the service. The annual service cost would be \$6,400. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Pierce to approve a contract for the Hyper Reach Emergency Mass Notification Service with a cost share in the future with other entities and temporary until renewal with the cost of \$6,400 to be paid from the LATCF Grant funds for public safety. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #5. Motion carried; 3.) Cuming County has a 2005 Ford F350 truck and an enclosed mobile command trailer that is contracted through the National Forestry Service and is for sale at to another entity. E.M. Taylor said the mobile command trailer could be multi-agency and available for other services such as fire and rescue, could be used as a cooling shelter at events, used for more interactive exercises in the future and as a temporary office space in case of a disaster or other issue at the Courthouse. Motion by Supr. Borgmann, seconded by Supr. Schlote to purchase from Cuming County a contracted National Forestry Service 2005 Ford F350 6.0 Dually and an enclosed mobile command trailer with a purchase price of at approximately \$630. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent District #5. Motion carried; 4.) E.M. Taylor asked the Board if he could attend an Emergency Management Conference in Okoboji, Iowa in May. Lodging would be at a friend's home so there would be no lodging costs, and the distance to drive is the same as the conference in Kearney, Nebraska. General consensus was to allow E.M. Taylor to attend the conference May 7 – 9, 2025 in Okoboji,

Iowa; 5.) With the use of the ATracker App, E.M. Taylor gave a percentage breakdown of his work for one month, such as administration, training, travel, meetings, and response.

Committee and Legislative updates were given.

Officials' updates were given as follows: 1.) Sheriff Henery informed the Board that the City of Crofton hired an uncertified police officer who will be attending training and during that training, the City of Crofton will keep the County agreement for law enforcement. Also, he discussed staffing; 2.) County Attorney Knox Jensen said that there will be two jury trials in the near future; 3.) Supr. Schlote has received complaints of irrigation systems spraying water on roads. Discussion was held with County Attorney Knox Jensen regarding safety and penalties.



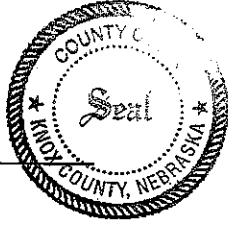


