Hwy. Supt. Barta continued with the following: 4. Discussed purchasing a self-propelled road broom. More research will be made; 5. Bloomfield North road project update. Discussed lowering the number of concrete miles on the project. The Board directed Hwy. Supt. Barta to advertise for concrete bids for both the longer distance and the proposed shorter distance; 6. Purchasing a pickup was discussed. More research will be made and discussed at the next meeting; 7. Update on County/Township Allocation; 8. Discussed constructing an additional cold storage building at the Creighton County Yard; 9. The gravel bid opening will be held March 26 and the oil bid opening will be held April 9.

Santee Sioux Tribal members met with the Board regarding road maintenance. Tribal Secretary Stuart Redwing spoke on behalf of the group. At a recent emergency Tribal meeting, concerns were raised about the condition of roads, maintenance, and repairs needed since last year's flooding. Discussion ensued on gravel needed on the roads since the flood, needing the Center bottom road to remain open as that is a main artery of transportation for the tribal members and the public, asking for a better plan for the gravel roads, the Tribe applying for grants that would assist in improving the roads, working on funding to hard surface the Lindy/Santee road, soft spots on the road, questioning the cost distribution of the "Ray Stark" bridge between the BIA and Knox County, township roads needing to have the snow removed and graveled, and, detours when County roads are closed, taxes being paid by tribal members, finding gravel and rock, and the need to have the detours graveled and maintained. Chairman Mackeprang led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Notice of the emergency meeting was given in advance thereof by notice on the Knox County website, within the Knox County Courthouse on the bulletin board, on the exterior Courthouse and Annex doors, at the Center Post Office, and forwarded via email to all Knox County newspapers to post on their websites. It was also listed on the Knox County News and Verdigre Eagle Facebook pages.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

Reading of the minutes of the March 12, 2020 meeting was dispensed with until the March 26, 2020 meeting.

The emergency meeting was held due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and the safety of the public and the safety of the Courthouse staff.

Sheriff Henery informed the Board that his office will cease conducting vehicle identification number inspections until further notice.

Discussion was held on the dwindling disinfecting supplies that are difficult to replenish, closing the Knox County Courthouse Campus buildings to the public except by appointment, procedures for staff, jail issues, tracking of inventory expenses and payroll hours worked that would be over and above the usual expenses so that these amounts spent can be tracked in case of reimbursement for COVID-19 expenses, HVAC between the basement and first floor, and procedures for County sheds.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote that for the safety of the public and the Knox County Courthouse Campus staff along with the CDC Recommendation on social distancing due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) global pandemic, the Knox County Courthouse and Annex buildings be closed to the public except by appointment until further notice along with the following directions: that all staff will report to the offices at the usual hours and maintain county business, each official will be responsible for letting their employees into the buildings if they do not have access; all walk-in members of the public will be limited to entry into the Courthouse Campus buildings by appointment only; all customers are required to call ahead and make an appointment with the specific office where they must conduct business; determine if it is necessary to have a customer come into the building or if the business can be done by other means such as by phone, fax, mail or email; customers may leave their documents, payments, etc. in the drop box located in the Courthouse Foyer that is open 24/7 and is audio/video monitored by a security camera; officials will be responsible for escorting their customers with appointments to their office area and back out of the building, and customers will not be allowed in the offices except for the driver's exams on Fridays so limited business may be conducted in the Courthouse Foyer or hallways and that these conditions may change rapidly so it will be a day by day basis. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the County's sick leave/vacation time policy in the Knox County Employee Handbook. County Attorney Thomas said that President Trump signed into law new legislation in response to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic and the law will take effect April 2, 2020. The law is broad and addresses a variety of relief efforts related to coping with COVID-19 and among the broad-sweeping provisions, the "Family First Coronavirus Response Act" makes changes to the Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) including mandatory emergency paid leave under certain circumstances, and by creating the Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act as a standalone provision. It also created certain tax credits for employers which correspond to the new requirements under the expanded FMLA and Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act. Sick leave, vacation time and catastrophic leave will need to be used first and the expansion allows for pay of up to 2/3 of their wages up to six weeks after the sick leave, vacation time and catastrophic leave are exhausted. More information will be provided at the next regular Board meeting.

County Attorney Thomas met with the Board to discuss the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) that was signed by President Trump and will take effect April 1, 2020 and runs through December 31, 2020. The Act was approved due to the fallout of the COVID-19 virus and requires certain employers to provide their employees with paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. County Attorney Thomas informed the Board that they could apply the date of March 21, 2020 as the start date of FFCRA because that was the date the Board closed the Courthouse to the public except by appointment until further notice due to the COVID-19 virus. Motion by Supr. Liska, seconded by Supr. Borgmann acknowledges the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) H.R. 6201 (2020) was signed by President Trump due to the COVID-19 virus pandemic that runs from April 1 and December 31, 2020 however the Board approves the FFCRA to begin for Knox County on March 21, 2020 and to run through December 31, 2020 as March 21, 2020 was the date the Board closed the Courthouse to the public except by appointment until further notice due to the COVID-19 virus pandemic. Sheriff Henery presented a draft of an interlocal agreement for county law enforcement between Knox County and the Village of Niobrara from April 1, 2020 continuing in effect from year to year through June 30, 2023 or until termination. Discussion was held on inventory, employees, contract cost would increase 2.5% each fiscal year and that the Niobrara Village Board will not meet until April 7 to review and possibly adopt the interlocal agreement. Liska to approve the interlocal agreement for County law enforcement between Knox County and the Village of Niobrara from April 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023 or until termination and with the change of item #13 of the interlocal agreement to give the Village of Niobrara's inventory back when done with the contract, the Niobrara Village vehicle will be returned when the vehicle is no longer needed, and the Village would pay Knox County \$75,270 for the County's FY2020, \$77,151 for County's FY 2021, \$79,080 for County's FY2022 (corrected 4/9/2020), and

monthly payments of \$6,120 each on April 8, May 15, and June 15, 2020. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #1. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Hintz updated the Board on the following: 1. Delivered supplies to the Creighton Avera hospital and health clinics in the county; 2. Supplies that had been kept in the storage building from the small pox scare years ago were divided and delivered to the rescue squads and law enforcement in the county; 3. Many conference calls are taking place; 4. Nebraska is able to do 100 tests per day. The North Central District Health Department just posted that the tested sixteen Knox County residents, there were nine tested negative, two positive and three probable; 5. Fiftynine Nebraska counties, fifty-one cities and the Ponca Tribe have adopted State of Emergency Disaster Declarations; 6. Funeral directors are testing to see what the deceased in their charge died from.

Extension Educator Hanefeldt updated the Board via telephone conference on the following: 1. Construction continues on the walls for the newly created divided office spaces within the main office; 2. Mrs. Hanefeldt is currently working remotely in her home as she cannot come into the office by direction of the University of Nebraska and may be this way for six to eight more weeks; 3. Update on the chick hatching program; 4. The Extension Board is scheduled to hold a meeting on April 7, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. and would have to be held virtually or be cancelled. The Board approved the meeting be held remotely; 5. 4-H has Tuesday and Thursday virtual living room learning sessions at 2:00 p.m. each of these days.

Sheriff Henery is having difficulty making contact with Skyline Healthcare LLC that is shown on the Distress Warrant list. The company is delinquent in paying personal property taxes and Sheriff Henery is attempting to collect the tax or to take the personal property for a sale to pay tax. Sheriff Henery asked the Board if they would want to strike this Distress Warrant. Supr. Schlote will attempt to find a different phone number for the company.

The Board discussed suspending reuse loan principal and interest payments because of the COVID-19 virus fallout. # INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT AND RESOLUTION BETWEEN KNOX COUNTY AND CEDAR COUNTY

**Resolution #2020 - 07** 

1. Both parties hereto are political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska; and,

- 2. The Interlocal Cooperative Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §13-801 to §13-827, permits local governmental units to make the most efficient use of their powers to enable them to cooperate with other governmental units in an effort to provide services and facilities in a manner that will accord with the needs of their communities, and,
- 3. KNOX and CEDAR Counties wish to replace bridge No. C001420140 on a county line road located on 552 Avenue, approximately 6.5 miles north of Highway 12 on the KNOX/CEDAR county line; and,
- 4. Improvements include removal and disposal of existing 32' x 20'6" wooden bridge, purchase and installation of 40' x 28'6" steel/concrete bridge; and Knox County will dispose of all wooden materials from old bridge.
- 5. CEDAR County will pay for the necessary steel products package that will be purchased from Husker Steel of Columbus, NE.
- 6. KNOX County will provide all necessary machines and man power to build the new bridge. Hours worked on the bridge project will be kept on a spread sheet for all personnel and equipment used on a daily basis. Knox County personnel (including Bridge Foreman and Knox County Highway Superintendent) will charge at a rate of their current hourly wage plus their fringe benefit package (health insurance, retirement, unemployment, workers compensation, etc.) Knox County will use the rate of 1.5651% for regular time pay per hour and 1.1433% for all overtime pay per hour, which is Knox County's FEMA benefit rate. Following is hourly rates that will be used for Knox County equipment (operator not included):

30 Ton Crane: \$200.00/hour

GMC Bridge Truck (carry leads): \$70.00/hour

Welders: \$30:00/hour

Case 621 B Loader: \$110.00/hour JD 310K Backhoe: \$100.00/hour 10 yard Dump Truck: \$90.00/hour

T750 Bobcat Skid Loader: \$100.00/hour Chevrolet Bridge Truck: \$70.00/hour

Motorgrader: \$120.00/hour

Pickups—charged at (State Rate)/mile 57.5¢/mile International Truck & Lowboy: \$100.00/hour

- 7. CEDAR County will provide a surveyed center line for the new bridge location. Place survey pins at two locations north and two locations south of bridge. Survey pins should be approximately 50' x 100' north and south of bridge.
- 8. The Counties agree that KNOX and CEDAR Counties pay equal amounts (50-50) of the required drainage study, removal and disposal of the old structure, the purchase and installation of the new structure and any other related costs; and,
- 9. Each County is responsible for acquiring all required right-of-way or temporary right-of-way easements in their respective county needed to construct the project; and,
- 10. Sufficient funds of KNOX County and CEDAR County are now, or will be, available and are hereby pledged at the required time for the purpose of paying for said project; and,
- 11. Each County that is a party to this contract agrees to indemnify and hold harmless, protect and defend the other as well as its elected and appointed officials, employees and representatives against any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, payments and judgements, including any and all costs and expenses connected therewith, for the damages asserted, claimed or recovered against the other or its insurers, because of personal injury, including bodily injury or death, or on account of property damage, in any way connected with or resulting from the work associated with this agreement; and,
- 12. Each County shall maintain general liability insurance coverage of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate covering personal injury, including bodily injury and property damage involved with this agreement. Each party will carry automobile liability limits of not less than \$1,000,000 single limit. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to approve Application #P0153 Michael Christiansen zoning lot combination and boundary adjustment of Lots 176, 177 and 178, Block 4, Devils Nest Subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Denny and Karen Tilton met with the Board regarding a building permit application they submitted to Zoning Administrator Doerr for construction of a garage. Present were Zoning Administrator Doerr and County Attorney Thomas. The lot they proposed to build on is located across the cul de sac from their house causing the application to be not accepted due to zoning regulations. Discussion was held on options presented by Zoning Administrator Doerr, that the SID#2 does not want to vacate the cul de sac and there are lots for sale along the cul de sac that would join the Tiltons' lots if they purchased them. County Surveyor Mike Skroch met with the Board with updates. There is a new state surveyor who is requiring more drawings for surveys and setting section corners and that the county surveyor records need to be located in the county surveyor's office. If this is not done, then the records are to be kept in the County Clerk's Office. County Attorney Thomas was present and informed the Board that for many years there was not an elected county surveyor in Knox County so the records were kept in the Highway Superintendent's office where they are today. Banks contacted area landowners and renters about the need to spray the leafy spurge and received a good response from all of them. Discussion was held on spraying of leafy spurge in township road ditches which is by statute the responsibility of the entity to control.

Highway Supt. Office Manager Katie Fritz met with the Board on the following: 1. The Board reviewed quotes from B's Enterprises, Inc. for culverts with headwalls to possibly be used on the Lazy River Acres Road. Concrete 48" x 30' culverts were quoted at \$7,000 each and steel 48" x 40' culverts were \$2,920 each. Supr. **WHEREAS**, it was further recommended by the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts that the approved expenditures be made through the claims process, and

**WHEREAS**, creating a new fund within 2020/2021 budget would put Knox County in compliance of statute and recommendations of the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts, and

A telephone conference was held with Ed Knott of Applied Connective Technology regarding renewing the Courthouse firewall subscription that will soon expire. The device is six years old and reaches end of life in August. The proposal for the WatchGuard site includes advanced cyber security services, reporting, quarterly perimeter vulnerability assessments, extended warranty and other features the County does not have now with a cost of \$1,320 annually. Further discussion was held on other options and costs. The matter was tabled until the next meeting for more option information from Mr. Knott.

Christiansen for a zoning lot combination of part of Lot 177 and Lots 178, 735 and 736, Block 4, Devils Nest Subdivision. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2. Zoning Administrative Doerr is not issuing building permits on the platted lots in the Devils Nest Subdivision until the CCR issue is resolved; 3. Planning Commission will meet on July 14; 4. Supr. Schlote received a call with a complaint about building at a feed lot northwest of Bloomfield.

Sheriff Henery met with the Board on the following: 1. An airflow study was conducted so that prisoners can be accepted back into the jail and the study found that the air exhaust fan is not working properly. Heartland Heating and Air quoted repairs to the fan of approximately \$1,000 plus labor or to replace the fan would be \$1,700 plus labor. The Board directed Sheriff Henery to have a new air exhaust fan installed in the jail and the cost to be paid from the Building and Grounds function in the General Fund; 2. New prisoners will be quarantined for fourteen days. The Osmond hospital is conducting ten to fifteen-minute coronavirus testing so prisoners will be taken there for testing. managing and evaluating the day-to-day tasks associated with conducting the 4-H program; the assistant would be a contract employee of the University with Knox County reimbursing the University for wages and benefits; the assistant would report to Educator Hanefeldt who would also evaluate the person and provide that information to the Knox County Extension Board; the County would only pay for hours worked and would be billed quarterly; the amount of the agreement, to begin on the hire date, will be determined by the minimum annual salary for the Extension Assistant as set by the University of Nebraska Board of Regents in the amount of approximately \$35,816 at this time plus the County would pay the benefit cost of approximately \$17,000; no anticipated wage increase at this time as there is a wage-freeze at the University level; and the remaining part-time office staff would go to full-time starting January 1, 2021. Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Absent was Supervisor Virgil H. Miller District #3. Chairman Mackeprang presiding.

Supervisor Sokol, Jr. led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mackeprang announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Niobrara Tribune newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was opened to the attendance of the public.

The minutes of the October 29, 2020 meeting were read and approved by Chairman Mackeprang.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Schlote that all claims, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1 #2, #4, #5, #6 and #7. Nays none. Absent was District #3. Motion carried. Claims totaling \$489,052.18 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Mackeprang moves the Board recess at 10:00 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:12 a.m. with all members present.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1. Jason Muhle with KEA Contractors met with the Board regarding the workdays on the Ray Stark bridge project. The company went over the contracted workdays by twenty days with a cost according to the agreement of \$300 per day for a total of \$6,000 of liquidated damages. Hwy. Supt. Barta said that the final payment is due and needs to be adjusted because of the twenty days liquidated damages. Mr. Muhle said that they started the project early in March but there was idle time while waiting for the girders to be built. There was a delay in the girders being built because of the COVID-19 issues at the plant, and once the girders were made, there was a thirty-day wait period before they can be used plus his own crew had COVID-19 issues after the girders arrived. Also, KEA Contractors were billed for nice working days according to the agreement even though they were not able to work on the project due to the delay in getting the girder. The construction company worked ninety-nine days and were idle fortyone days. Hwy. Supt. Barta said that the engineer was not there for forty-one days so that was a cost savings. Hwy. Supt. Barta said the construction crew were exceptional workers always keeping the area picked up and that local traffic was able to get through. Discussion was held on due diligence to complete the project as well as Mike Crosley with the Santee Sioux Nation said that there wasn't a problem with the BIA on the overage of workdays and the County could decide about the charges. Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Sokol, Jr. to deduct \$3,000 from the final payment to KEA Contractors for going over the agreed workdays on construction of the Ray Stark Bridge in Harrison Township noting that the total amount of overage was actually twenty days and would have been a cost of \$300 per day according to the agreement with KEA Contractors, Knox County and the BIA. # **RESOLUTION #2020 - 36**

**WHEREAS**, the duly appointed Planning Commission of Knox County, Nebraska, with the assistance of its consultant Marvin Planning Consultants, has prepared an amendment to the Zoning Regulations and Subdivision Regulations, for Knox County, Nebraska; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission has reviewed the amendment and the zoning map of the Lake Area Overlay District and make recommendation to the Knox County Board of Supervisors for approval;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, THAT THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENT AND ZONING MAP FOR THE LAKE AREA OVERLAY DISTRICT BE APPROVED AND ADOPTED:

# Section 4.15 LA Lake Area Overlay District 4.15.1 Intent:

Knox County has established this overlay for the purpose of guiding future development as a planned area. In addition, Knox County desires to ensure proper construction in key parts of the overlay area in order to protect the future value of construction of new structures as well as nearby existing structures.

#### GEORGRAPHIC AREA:

The LA Overlay District shall apply to those areas in the northern portions of Knox County near Lewis and Clark Lake from near Devils Point to the Gavins Point Dam. See the Future Land Use and Official

Zoning Maps for actual location.

#### 4.15.2 Permitted Uses:

The following principal uses are permitted in the LA District.

1. All permitted uses contained in the underlying base zoning district unless specifically noted in these regulations.

# 4.15.3 Conditional Uses:

The following uses are subject to any conditions listed in this Resolution and are subject to other conditions relating to the placement of said use on a specific tract of ground in the LA Overland District as recommended by the Planning Commission and approved by the County Board of Supervisors.

- 1. All conditional uses contained in the underlying base zoning district unless specifically noted in these regulations.
- 2. Mixed uses within a development provided the development is accompanied by a Planned Unit Development.

# 4.15.4 Accessory Uses:


The following Accessory uses are allowed as follows:

1. All accessory uses contained in the underlying base zoning district unless specifically noted in these regulations.

# 4.15.5 Special Criteria:

The following special criteria are established for the protection of specific future investments within the Knox County Lake Area:

- 1. Any new residential or commercial uses shall determine the existing slope and plasticity of the land.
  - a. If the existing slope is 20% to 29%, the applicant should provide Knox County with engineering data indicating how the new structure will address the slope of the property, if available.
  - b. If the plasticity is considered either medium or high, the applicant should provide Knox County with engineering data of how the structure will address the existing soil conditions, if available.
  - c. Structures constructed on slopes of 30% or greater, should supply suitable engineering designs indicating:
    - i. The soil is not in a condition which promotes future landslides.
    - ii. The new structure will be engineered to be anchored to the slope and will not slide down the slope.
    - iii. The new structures construction and location will not jeopardize any existing structures down slope or adjacent to the new structure.
    - iv. Engineering data should be supplied if available.
  - d. Any required engineering design shall be sealed by a civil engineer.
- 2. Any new commercial development shall locate along the south side of Highway 54C.
- 3. New commercial uses may be allowed within some areas as a mixed-use development; however, any mixed-use development shall be processed as a planned unit development as found in this Resolution.
- 4. Mobile home and Recreational Vehicle Parks shall be located a minimum of 300 feet from any existing residential development. These facilities shall be screened from residential uses/developments and roadways by either natural landscape or newly planted vegetative screen.
- 5. New developments within this overlay district should determine with Knox County any roadway improvements needed, as well as the anticipated daily trips in and out of the development.
- 6. If individual wells and septic systems are to be used in new developments/subdivisions, the develop shall show how they will mitigate existing soil conditions.
- 7. If individual wells and septic systems are not possible, together, then the development/subdivision shall either create a centralized water system or hook into the rural water district.
- 8. The minimum lot size within this overlay district shall be ½ acre unless soil conditions dictate larger lots.
- 9. New subdivisions and developments and/or the Homeowners Association shall be required to eliminate dead vegetation throughout the development.
- 10. New developments, as well as developments going through replatting shall be required to have two points of ingress and egress unless otherwise determined by the County Highway Superintendent and County Board that this is not feasible.

There was no public comment on agenda items

Public comment on non-agenda items was given by Supr. O'Connor and Hwy. Supt. Barta on requests for additional ingress and egress for the new campgrounds at Wolf Run and tracts being sold in the lake area.

Public comment on non-agenda items was given by Supr. O'Connor, Zoning Administrator Doerr and County Assessor McManigal about a recent two-hour Zoom meeting with Consultant Keith Marvin on updates to campground and lake area regulations in the Comprehensive Plans. Supr. O'Connor, Zoning Administrator Doerr, Planning Commission member Doug de Shazer, County Assessor McManigal, Deputy County Assessor Beckmann and Mr. Marvin reviewed the campground regulations and proposed changes.

Emergency Manager Hintz updated the Board on the Hazard Mitigation Grant. Also discussed was the COVID-19 vaccine, the health departments are in charge of the process, and the new strain of the coronavirus making its way into the United States. (Corrected 1-14-2021)

County Clerk Fischer updated the Board on the Family First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) that mandated emergency paid sick leave and emergency paid family and medical leave. FFCRA expired December 31, 2020, however, the Act allows employers that were covered by FFCRA to encourage employees to be honest and stay home for COVID-19 related reasons by voluntarily offering the eighty (80) hours of emergency paid sick leave made under the FFCRA for any employees that have not used this benefit. In this scenario, public employers would assume the entire cost of the program, including the emergency paid sick leave benefits and to require employer's portion of the Social Security tax. Employers are still encouraged to follow CDC guidelines to control the spread of COVID-19, including asking employees to stay home if they are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, if they have tested positive for COVID-19, or if they have had close contact (i.e., within six feet for a total of fifteen minutes or more) with someone who has COVID-19). Motion by Supr. Sokol, Jr., seconded by Supr. Liska to extend the current Emergency Paid Sick Leave with the current conditions set out by the Federal Government and NIRMA until March 31, 2021 noting that this is an extension and to be used by employees who have not used the Emergency Paid Sick Leave benefit.
