Director Hanvey said that she is proposing entering into a six-month agreement with Five Rule Rural Planning with a cost of \$16,000 to be paid from the C & C Development Fund. The Board said that the Development Agency Board should be reviewing this agreement and proposal and making the decision on the services/agreement. No action was taken.

Schlote to authorize Chairman Sokol, Jr. to sign the annual Noxious Weed reports and to place them on file. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried; 2.) Weed Supt. Banks received a grant for Knox County for spraying phragmites in the Lazy River Acres area; 3.) As the Weed Dept. pickup is parked in the back of the Wausa County shed for the winter and is blocked in, Weed Supt. Banks drove his personal vehicle to two meetings and requested mileage reimbursement. The Board approved mileage reimbursement to Weed Supt. Banks and that Weed Supt. Banks should submit an invoice.

WHEREAS: Antelope County has secured up to \$193,548.00 from the County Bridge Match Program (CBMP) through the State of Nebraska for its replacement. Antelope County has entered into a programming agreement with the State of Nebraska that outlines the conditions of obtaining the funding. These funds will be put toward the cost of replacing the bridge with a new structure. The remaining costs of designing, permitting, and constructing a new bridge will be split equally between Antelope and Knox Counties.

WHEREAS: the two counties will split the costs of Preliminary Engineering, Permitting, Construction and Construction Engineering. Each County will pay half of all invoices and contracts associated with the project. Once all expenses have been paid, Antelope County will submit a reimbursement request to the State of Nebraska for reimbursement of funds under the County Bridge Match Program and all reimbursed funds will be split equally between the two Counties.

WHEREAS: Any additional right-of-way required for construction will be obtained by the County in which the needed land is located at the sole expense of that County.

BE IT RESOLVED: That Antelope County, Nebraska is hereby requested to act for Knox, Nebraska and to program for construction, have design plans prepared, and obtain necessary permits for replacement of structure C000220220.

Hwy. Supt. Barta continued with the following: 4.) The Frankfort Township Board requested that a .75-mile section of the East-West Platted Road #732 in Section 19, T33N, R2W be reclassified to Minimum Maintenance. An adjoining landowner to the road wants to vacate a portion of the road and reclassify the rest of the road to Minimum Maintenance. The matter was tabled for more information; 5.) Discussion was held on the Rec Road possible upgrade. Deputy County Attorney Jensen had submitted a Congressionally Directed Spending Request grant application to Senator Deb Fischer to upgrade nine miles of the Rec Road. Hwy. Supt. # RESOLUTION #2024-07 Knox County

# INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT AND RESOLUTION BETWEEN KNOX COUNTY AND ANTELOPE COUNTY

- 1. Knox County and Antelope County (together referred to as "Parties") are political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska: and
- 2. The Interlocal Cooperative Act, Neb. Rev. State. §§13-801 to 13-827, permits local governmental units to make the most efficient use of their powers to enable them to cooperate with other governmental units in an effort to provide services and facilities in a manner that will accord with the needs of their local communities; and
- 3. The Parties wish to replace Bridge No. C005416210 (hereinafter "Bridge") on a county line road located on 870 Road approximately 1.2 miles east of 517 Avenue on the Knox/Antelope County line; and
- 4. Replacement of the Bridge includes removal and disposal of existing 18' x 61' steel pony truss, purchase, and installation of 24'6" x 80' steel/concrete bridge, and Knox County will dispose of all materials from old bridge.
- 5. Antelope County will pay for the steel products package necessary to rebuild the Bridge that will be purchased from an accepted bidder.
- So. Knox County will use its equipment and personnel to tear out the old Bridge and build the new Bridge. Hours worked on the bridge project will be kept on a spreadsheet for all personnel and equipment used daily. Knox County personnel (including Bridge Foreman and Knox County Highway Superintendent) will charge at a rate of their current hourly wage plus their fringe benefit package (health insurance, retirement, unemployment, worker's compensation, etc.) Knox County will use the rate of 1.5651% for regular time pay per hour and 1.1433% for all overtime pay per hour, which is Knox County's FEMA benefit Rate. Following are hourly rates that will be used for use of Knox County equipment (operator not included):

30 Ton Crane: \$225.00/hr

1770 Bobcat Skid Loader: \$100.00/hr GMC Bridge Truck (carry leads): \$ 70.00/hr Chevrolet Bridge Truck: \$ 70.00/hr Welders: \$ 30.00/hr Motor grader: \$130.00/hr Case 621B Loader: \$130.00/hr Pickups-charged at (state rate)/mile: \$ .67/mile JD 310K Backhoe: \$120.00/hr International Truck & Lowboy: \$120.00/hr 10-yard Dump Truck: \$135.00/hr

- 7. The Parties agree that Knox and Antelope Counties pay equal amounts (50-50) of ALL expenses, including engineering, steel package, required drainage study, removal and disposal of the old structure, the purchase and installation of the new structure, wages for Knox County personnel working on replacement of the Bridge, hourly rates for use of Knox County equipment in replacing the Bridge, and any and all other costs related to the replacement of the Bridge; and
- 8. Each County is responsible for acquiring all required right-of-way or temporary right-of-way easements in their respective county needed to construct the project, if needed.
- 9. Sufficient funds of Knox County and Antelope County are now, or will be, available and are hereby pledged at the required time for the purpose of paying for said project; and
- 10. Each County that is a party to this contract agrees to indemnify and hold harmless, protect and defend the other as well as its elected and appointed officials, employees and representatives against any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, payments and judgments, including any and all costs and expenses connected therewith, for the damages asserted, claimed or recovered against the other or its insurers, because of personal injury, including bodily injury or death, or on account of property damage, in any way connected with or resulting from the work associated with this agreement, and
- 11. Each County shall maintain general liability insurance coverage of not less that \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate covering personal injury, including bodily injury and property damage involved with the agreement. Each party will carry automobile liability limits of not less than \$1,000,000 single limit. Each party will maintain responsibility for providing its workers with workers' compensation coverage and for any claims associated with its employees.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Knox County and Antelope County hereby enter into agreement to replace Bridge No. C005416210 located on 870 Road approximately 1.2 miles east of 517 Avenue on the Knox/Antelope County line, in accordance with the terms listed above.

Mr. Webster also expressed that National Grid Renewables believes the recommended 1.25-mile setback is not feasible and that the current setbacks are satisfactory, that the recommended change is an infringement on property owners who want wind towers on their property, and National Grid Renewables is committed to obtain the conditional permits.

Scott Gropp, an attorney for concerned citizens, updated the Board on the concerns people have regarding the proposed North Fork Wind Project, case law, request that the recommended setback of 1.25-mile be approved, misrepresentation to landowners by National Grid Renewables, reference to a NIRMA article referencing wind turbine energy controversy, and a Holt County Planning Commission member who felt misled after a wind project was constructed in that county.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1.) Motion by Supr. Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Schlote to commit to the purchase of a used 2021 John Deere 772G motorgrader along with a new Brandt wing from Murphy Tractor of Sioux City, Iowa with a cost of \$360,000 less trade-in of a 2012 JD 772G motorgrader and a wing in the amount of \$49,000 for a total of \$311,000 and to waive the bidding requirements of the County Purchasing Act (Nebraska Revised Statute §23-3109) as the Board had to take the immediate commitment to the purchase of the used motorgrader as there was no hold on the motorgrader. Concerned citizens of Lazy River Acres met with the Board. The first one-half hour session was designated to comments in favor of the recommendations to change the current set-back regulations regarding wind systems with eight people speaking on a number of concerns including safety issues, size of proposed towers in the National Grid Renewables proposed project, noise levels, information and issues of other wind projects in Nebraska, problems farming the fields where towers are located and more. The second one-half hour session was designated to comments in favor of no change to the current set-back regulations with eleven people speaking on economic improvement with the proposed project, nameplate capacity tax, the need for clean energy, no problems with the current two wind projects in Knox County, support from an ag board, job creation, and more. The process was repeated with a third session having eight people speaking on accepting the recommendations and a fourth session where ten people spoke on leaving the current setbacks in place.

At 2:50 p.m., the Board members present each gave testimony on their reasons and beliefs of the proposed recommendations by the Planning Commission. **AMENDED:** The Planning Commission's recommendation was as follows: **Proposed amendment** 1: Kotrous makes a motion to recommend a change of setback for Wind Energy

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 12:50 p.m. with all members present except for Supervisor Patrick J. Liska District #2.

Discussion continued on the 2024/2025 budget. The Board directed that \$218,777.25 of the purchase of the motorgrader be deducted from the Road Fund and paid from the accrued interest in the Flowage Easement Road Fund as the motorgrader will be used in the Niobrara area, the remainder of the motorgrader cost of \$92,222.75 be paid from the Road Fund, a transfer of \$303,240.92 be made from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund/Flowage Easement Road Fund for the 4th loan payment on the Bloomfield North project, and a transfer of \$200,000 be made from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund to be added to the cash reserve. This will drop the tax asking to \$4,027,728.88 which would be \$84,853.52 more than last year, an estimated levy of 0.137431 which is 0.023840 less than last year.

With the revisions to the 2024/2025 tax request for Knox County, Knox County will not have to participate in the LB 644 Joint Public Hearing. As per the requirements of the Joint Public Hearing, the Board must set the date, time, and location of the 2024 Joint Public Hearing. At this time, it appears that Bloomfield School, Santee School, and Bloomfield City will be participating. Motion by Supr. Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. WHEREAS, the Knox County Board approved at their August 26, 2021 meeting to pay for the Bloomfield North project from the Flowage Easement Road Fund, as a loan to be repaid over 10 years or earlier and the repayment to be made by taxation, or if needed sometime during the repayment period, to use some funds from the Inheritance Fund, and

WHEREAS, the Flowage Easement Road Fund was created when the County of Knox sued the U.S. Corps of Engineers and received \$10,049,868 from the Court settlement to cover the expenses associated with rebuilding bridges and roads damaged by the Missouri River and its' tributaries due to sedimentation, and

WHEREAS, the funds to repay the loan to the Flowage Easement Road Fund will be collected in the General Fund and then transferred to the Flowage Easement Road Fund, and
