A regular meeting of the Knox County Board of Supervisors was held in the Boardroom at the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska on the date of Wednesday, April 1, 2026 at 9:30 a.m. Present were Supervisors Martin J. O'Connor District #1, Kevin G. Mlady District #2, David L. Pierce District #3, James Sokol, Jr. District #4, Kevin D. Mackeprang District #5, Danny R. Schlote District #6 and James J. Borgmann District #7. Absent was none. Chairman Sokol, Jr. presiding.

Supr. Pierce led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. announced to the public that a copy of the Public Open Meeting Act was posted in the Boardroom.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Niobrara Tribune newspaper, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members and a copy of their acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken during the convened meeting that was opened to the attendance of the public.

County Clerk Fischer read the minutes of the March 18, 2026 meeting. Chairman Sokol, Jr. approved the minutes of the March 18, 2026 meeting.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. opened the public comment session at 9:55 a.m.

Motion by Supr. Schlote, seconded by Supr. Pierce that all claims except Claim #26040068, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. Pierce, seconded by Supr. Borgmann that Claim #26040068 payable to Kristel Mackeprang in the amount of \$450.00 written from the Road Fund, audited and approved for payment by the Claims Committee, be allowed subject to delinquent personal taxes. By roll call vote. Ayes Districts #1, #2, #3, #4, #6 and #7. Nays none. Abstain District #5. Motion carried.

Claims totaling \$333,382.35 are listed at the end of these proceedings.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. closed the public comment session at 10:05 a.m. No one gave public comments.

Chairman Sokol, Jr. moves the Board recess at 10:05 a.m. for Board of Equalization.

The Knox County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:13 a.m. with all members present.

Hwy. Supt. Barta met with the Board on the following: 1.) The gravel bid opening will be held at 10:30 a.m.; 2.) Bridge Crew update; 3.) Oil Crew update; 4.) A bridge conference will be held next week; 5.) A truck tarp needed to be repaired or replaced; 6.) Newly hired Mechanic Evan Larsen started employment this week; 7.) Snow fence was rolled up at the Verdigre County Yard.

Motion by Supr. Mlady, seconded by Supr. Schlote to place on file the Receipts Revenue List of March 16 – 27, 2026. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Building and Grounds Committee members Chairman Sokol, Jr., Supr. Pierce and Supr. Mackeprang informed the Board of a grant application that is being drafted for replacing the windows in the Courthouse Main building and possibly replacing the HVAC system in the Courthouse. The vinyl windows were installed in the 1980s and are twisting causing energy inefficiency. Lowell Schroeder with FIVE RULE Rural Planning has been assisting along with Senior Office Clerk Rhonda Surface to gather the information needed. As the grant funds are federal dollars, a number of requirements must be met including getting permission for the type and size of windows allowed according to the Nebraska State Historical Society. An agreement between FIVE RULE and Knox County needs to be signed as Mr. Schroeder continues with the grant process to submit a grant application to the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program on behalf of Knox County. Motion by Supr. Pierce, seconded by Supr. O'Connor to authorize Chairman Sokol, Jr. to sign the Professional Services Agreement between Knox County and FIVE RULE Rural Planning in the amount \$2,500 for contract executed March 31, 2026, \$2,500 for application submission for a total of \$5,000 and if the grant is awarded, \$125 per hour for time utilized for grant administration. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Supr. O'Connor, seconded by Supr. Mlady to adopt **Resolution #2026 – 09** that authorizes a grant application be submitted to the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program on behalf of Knox County in the amount of up to \$100,000 for replacing the windows in the Courthouse as well as possibly replacing the HVAC system. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Knox County Board of Supervisors authorizes the submission of a grant application to the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program on behalf of Knox County, Nebraska in the amount of up to \$100,000 for the replacement of windows and possibly replacing the HVAC system in the Knox County Courthouse in Center, Nebraska, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the grant application will be submitted to the Nebraska Department of Water, Energy, and Environment no later than April 15, 2026.

Schlote to approve a 2026 On-Site Wellness Health Screening of \$119 per participant for full-time Knox County employees as well as spouses who are enrolled in the 90 Degree Benefits Health Insurance; to allow a \$75 credit towards additional laboratory testing per participant; three steps must be followed by all participants being 1.) complete a Wellness Questionnaire through the LiveNOW Portal, 2.) attend the On-Site Wellness Health Screening or obtain a voucher to complete the physical requirements at an Avera clinic, and 3.) meet with Avera staff in a Health Coaching session to review each participant's Screening results and if not followed now or in the past they will not be allowed to participate; to approve reimbursement to those eligible employees and their spouses who are enrolled in the County's health insurance benefit through 90 Degree Benefits and participate and complete all required steps of the Health Screening with the reimbursement to be up to \$250 of 2026 deductible paid between \$250 and \$500 with Explanation of Benefits to be filed with County Clerk Fischer no later than March 31, 2027. Attorney Andrew Marshall was present and said the main point of the amendment is to amend the distance of Recreational Vehicle Parks from 1/2 mile to 300 feet in the river area which is already in place in the lake area. Discussion ensued on the river area regulations and that any discussion on the lake area regulations should be held at a different public hearing. Motion by Supr. Mackeprang, seconded by Supr. Borgmann to adopt **Resolution #2026 – 11** for amending Sec. 8.04 Recreational Vehicle Parks and Sec. 6.03 Schedule of Minimum Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirement Matrix for all zones in the Knox County Regulations. By roll call vote. Ayes all Districts. Nays none. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #2026 - 11

WHEREAS, the duly appointed Planning Commission of Knox County, Nebraska has prepared amendments to the Zoning Regulations for Knox County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has given public notice as required by the Nebraska State Statutes, of a hearing held on the 10th day of March 2026, at the Board of Supervisors' meeting room in the Knox County Courthouse on the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing has been held pursuant to said notices and all statements received at the hearing have been duly considered by the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Knox County Planning Commission has reviewed the amendments and make recommendation to the Knox County Board of Supervisors for approval; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KNOX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THAT THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED AND ADOPTED:

KNOX COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS:

-P. 145 Sec. 8.04 Recreational Vehicle Parks and Section 4.19 LA – Lake Area Overlay District 4.19.05 Special Criteria – distance Recreational Vehicle Parks shall be located from any existing residential development. Amends distance of Recreational Vehicle Parks shall be located from any existing residential development to 300 feet in all zones.

-Sec. 6.03 Schedule of Minimum Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements Matrix and Section 8.04 Recreational Vehicle Parks – minimum off-street parking spaces per each individual recreational vehicle, trailer, camp site. Amends Section 6.03 "Schedule of Minimum Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements" matrix to the minimum parking requirements of 2 spaces per camping unit or recreational vehicle.

–Strike #11-F – No porches, lean-tos, or additions shall be constructed onto any of these recreational dwellings. Amend Section 8.04 "Recreational Vehicle Parks" by striking entirely #11 (F) "NO porches, lean-tos, or additions shall be constructed onto any of these recreational dwelling. Canvas screen rooms or awnings shall be allowed." Striking this part of Section 8.04 creates consistency in the Knox County Regulations and current permitting.

Officials' updates were given by the following: 1.) E.M. Taylor discussed with the Board the deployment of Knox County firemen to the wildfires in western Nebraska and the comments of the integrity and teamwork of the Knox County firemen; 2.) County Clerk Fischer informed the Board that the new manager of Cedar County Transit is Ashley Gowery; 3.) The Center Post Office was damaged, so mail is delivered to the Creighton Post Office and picked up by Knox County department heads or staff currently; 4.) County Assessor Beckmann told the Board that there will be a webinar on destroyed property which will cover the property destroyed in western Nebraska due to the wildfires.

Committee updates were given by the following: 1.) Supr. Pierce gave an update on the Area Agency on Aging; 2.) Supr. Mlady has been attending the Santee Sioux tribal meetings and Santee Sioux Tribal Chairman Alonso Denney

asked if the County Board would consider giving a support letter for the Tribe's quest to get usable water to the reservation.



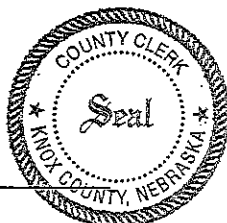
